ENS Paris-Saclay 2018-2019



ENS Paris-Saclay is a leading institution of Higher education whose mission is to train teaching researchers, researchers and graduate-level course instructors through research-oriented master's programs. The institution's **12 teaching départements** and **14 research units** focus on three main areas: basic sciences, engineering, sciences and human and social sciences. Students may be admitted to ENS Paris-Saclay in one of two ways: the first is

through a competition in which the qualifying applicants obtain the status of civil servant interns (known internally as « normaliens-élèves »); and the second is through an assessed application process in which the qualifying applicants obtain the status of students (known internally as « normaliens-étudiants »). The four years of instruction, including high-level scientific and cultural training, lead to European bachelor's, master's and PhD degrees.



Ecole Normale Supérieure de Cachan became Ecole Normale Supérieure Paris-Saclay, operating name of ENS Cachan, since September 2016. Our new building is currently under construction (picture above) and we will move to the “Plateau de Saclay” (30 kms from Paris) in 2019.

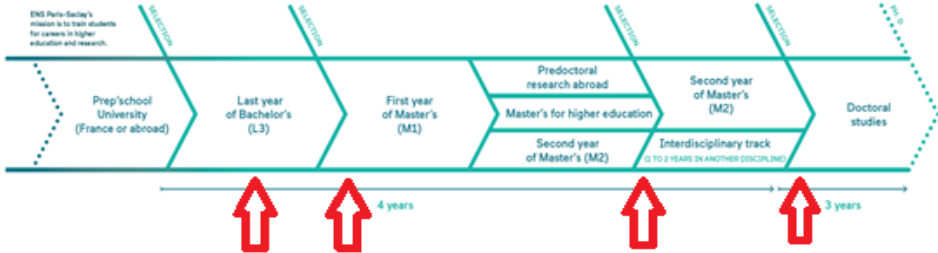

APPLICATION PROCESS

Training offer	To study in ENS Paris-Saclay: - You can register to a Université Paris-Saclay Master operated by ENS Paris-Saclay (Master programs offer: http://www.universite-paris-saclay.fr/fr/formation/masters). In case apply to Université Paris-Saclay webpage through the application portal https://apply-tc.ecp.fr/. - You can register to an ENS Paris-Saclay Master (Master programs offer: Audiovisuel et Cinéma, Design, Langues, Littérature et Civilisations Étrangères et Régionales, Physique fondamentale et leurs Applications). In case submit your application to the dedicated department and in accordance with the department application procedure. For students involved by the online procedure CEF (full list of nationalities involved is available here), <u>only after receiving admission acceptance</u> from Université Paris-Saclay or ENS Paris-Saclay, create an account on the French portal "Etudes en France" and complete the file from the tab "Je suis accepté".

PARIS WILL HOST THE 2024 OLYMPIC GAMES:



The International Olympic Committee awarded Paris as the 2024 Olympic Games host. 2024 will mark the 100-year anniversary of its previous hosting.

As President Macron stated the games “represent a tremendous opportunity to assist in the transformation of the country, to increase its international attractiveness, and strengthen the role of sport across France”.

In 2024 two million visitors are expected (including 10,000 athletes, 20,000 reporters and the staff of each delegation). Famous Paris venue such as Roland Garros, Champs de Mars, Grand Palais, Château de Versailles will host several tournaments.
