5. Course selection

The University of Aberdeen Course Catalogue can be found on the website https://www.abdn.ac.uk/mist/apps/catalogue/. Please note that credits are listed as Aberdeen Credits and 30 ECTS = 60 Aberdeen Credits.

Please be aware of the following conditions regarding course selection:

- incoming exchange students should select at least 50% of their curriculum from the subject area corresponding to our Inter-Institutional agreement
- incoming exchange students will generally be guided to courses at Levels 2 +3, and exceptionally at Level 4
- incoming exchange students wishing to take Level 3 English Language + Literature courses will need to pass a diagnostic test on arrival in Aberdeen. Level 4 English Language + Literature courses are not available to incoming exchange students
- the examinations for Level 4 Medical Science courses run in May only, so these courses are only suitable for students who will spend the full academic year on exchange in Aberdeen
- while we may receive 2nd cycle (ie Masters) students, we do not permit students to take Level 5 (ie Masters) courses

Incoming exchange students will be allocated a Go Abroad Tutor to assist with course selection. This will be the responsible person who signs Learning Agreement documents and tutors will be allocated according to the subject of the agreement: http://www.abdn.ac.uk/erasmus/outgoing-students/the-departments/.
