NOMINATION OF STUDENTS FOR UGA PARTNERSHIPS

Some of you may have an agreement with one of our faculties: procedure and deadlines may differ slightly.

Within the framework of your *agreement* with the UGA, your students have the possibility to choose their courses among a varied offer. [Please check International Exchange Students web page.](#)

The current international policy **does not limit the number of places** for incoming students to UGA. Some Faculties may limit their number of places if demand is very high.

Here are the steps to nominate your students to UGA:

1. IDENTIFY THE UGA HOST FACULTY

The students will have to follow the majority of their courses in a host faculty. To help you to identify the faculty you can consult [disciplines and teaching levels of all faculties](#) and the [course catalogue](#).

At the time of the application, the students will have to [fill in a learning agreement according to the rules defines by our faculties](#). **Warning:** The Faculty of Medicine only accepts students through their specific agreements.

2. STUDENT'S NOMINATIONS

To nominate students please check the deadlines of the UGA's online portal:

DEADLINES OF THE ONLINE NOMINATIONS PORTAL

2nd semester	August 27th	September 30th

Warning: We do not accept nominations sent after the deadline.

Only nominated students through the portal will be accepted. If you have already informed us about your nominated students, we kindly ask you to nominate them through the form.

3. APPLICATION PROCESS

The host faculty will send the online application form directly to the nominated student. There is no need to send documents by email or mail.

The required documents are:

- all academic transcript of records
- curriculum vitae
- any language test or a [certificate on the ability to take courses in the language of instruction](#)
- [certificate of motivation](#)
- [learning agreement](#) signed by the student and the sending university

4. DECISION

The host faculty will send the notification of the decision during the following dates:

Semester	Notification of decision
1st semester and full year	until June 14th
2nd semester	until November 12th

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic calendar may be different depending on the host faculty.

HOUSING

Student housing via ISSO

- In [residence hall of the CROUS](#):
from 150 to 430 € / month excluding charges
 - 9m² room: *Shared washrooms/Bed, desk, wardrobe/closet, shelves, chair, washbasin, shared kitchen*: From €160 to €180 / month
 - 12-20m² room: *private shower, toilet and washbasin/Bed, desk, wardrobe/closet, shelves, shelves, chair / Privatekitchenette*: From €360/month
 - Studio : From €430/month
- In private student residence:
Students may elect to live in private housing; costs in Grenoble range from 250 to 840 € / month.
- Rental of a studio (private rental):
about from 350 € + / month
- Room in a shared flat: about 400 €
- Renting a room with the inhabitant (private rental): about 280 € / month

Students do not have to contact directly the student housing department. They will receive an automatic email of the process to apply for housing.

Be careful to respect the procedure that will be sent and check spams

Exchange students who complete the housing application process by the deadlines indicated are guaranteed a placement proposal in student housing. **They won't be asked for a French guarantor.**

Note: If the student will be lodged in a CROUS residence, the student must arrive before the 8th day of the month.

Students who apply after the housing deadline may still be able to live in university housing if places are still available.

IMMIGRATION REQUIREMENTS

Visas and residence permits

Depending on your nationality, you may be exempted from obtaining a visa to enter metropolitan France and the [Schengen area](#).

Students residing outside the Schengen area should apply for a visa as soon as possible. Admitted students should begin the visa process as soon as possible. The letter will be sent by the international relations office of the host faculty.
